**Child Abuse Prevention Month-Reporting Child Abuse:** It is every adult's moral responsibility to report known or suspected abuse or neglect of a minor to the responsible authorities. Physical and sexual abuse of minors are pervasive societal problems, and only concerted and sustained efforts by all adults in every segment of society can help to protect children and youth. In the 2023 PA statewide report, there were 5,129 substantiated reports of child abuse. 1,749 or 34.1% of the substantiated reports were for sexual abuse, 1,350 were physical abuse. ## The Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession)

Learning to say the words "*I'm sorry*" to family, friends, or anyone whom we have hurt, is a good and necessary lesson we must learn in our life.

We, Catholics, have within our tradition a remedy for the actions we have done that are not pleasing to God and neighbor. The remedy is the Sacrament of Reconciliation. The purpose in going to confession is to acknowledge our sins with heartfelt sorrow, receive the forgiveness of God, and to do a penance, which is an action or prayer in making satisfaction for the sins we have committed.

We go to confession to a priest because Jesus Himself forgave sinners and gave that authority to forgive sins to His Apostles according to Matthew's Gospel 16: 19. "I will entrust to you the Keys of the Kingdom of Heaven. Whatever you declare bound on earth shall be bound in Heaven; whatever you declare loosed on earth shall be loosed in Heaven."

The bishops and priests by virtue of their ordination are the successors of the Apostles. So, we can go to the priest who represents the Church and Christ in this Sacrament and receive the healing forgiveness of Jesus our Lord.

As a friendly reminder, the steps of going to confession are as follows:

- First, we must to do an examination of conscience. Call to mind the sins you need to confess, both venial and mortal sins, and the number of times they were committed.
- Next, say to the priest: "Bless me, Father, for I have sinned. It has been (weeks, months or years) since my last confession. I have committed the following sins."

As you say these words, you make the Sign of the Cross.

- ✤ Next, you tell your sins to the priest.
- ✤ The priest then assigns a penance for you to do.
- ✤ Then, you pray the "Act of Contrition."

#### "O my God, I am heartily sorry for having offended Thee. I detest all my sins because of Thy just punishments; but most of all because they offend Thee my God, Who are all good and deserving of all my love. I firmly resolve with the help of Thy Grace to sin no more and to avoid the near occasion of sin. Amen."

The priest then prays the prayer of Absolution and concludes that prayer by saying: "In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen."

My friends, go to confession and believe with all your heart in the Healing Grace of the Sacrament of Reconciliation.
