

Divine Mercy Sunday (A Question and Its Promises)

The image of the Divine Mercy of Jesus our Lord began in 1931, in Poland, when our Lord Jesus Christ appeared to St. Faustina. In the vision, she saw Jesus, clothed in a white garment, with His Right Hand raised in a way as if He were giving a blessing. His Left Hand was touching His Garment in the area of His Heart, where two large rays of light came forth. One of the rays of light was red, and the other pale in color.

In the vision, our Lord explained to St. Faustina the meaning of His Mercy flowing from the rays. He explained that they represent blood and water. The pale ray stands for water, which makes the soul righteous. The red ray stands for blood, which is life for the soul. The image of our Divine Merciful Lord indicates and represents all of the Graces of Divine Mercy, which is being poured out upon the world and especially within the Holy Sacraments of Baptism and the Eucharist.

This feast day was established by St. Pope John Paul II when he made the announcement during his homily at the canonization of St. Faustina on April 30, 2000. It was there that he declared, "It is important then that we accept the whole message that comes to us from the Word of God on the Second Sunday of Easter, which from now on throughout the Church, will be called *Divine Mercy Sunday*."

What Graces can I receive on Mercy Sunday?

The promises and desires that Jesus expressed about Mercy Sunday are recorded in the *Diary of St. Maria Faustina #699*-the main passage of *Mercy Sunday*.

- * On that day, the very depths of My Tender Mercy are open.
- * I pour out a whole ocean of Graces upon souls who approach the Fount of My Mercy (the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Holy Eucharist).
- * The soul that will go to Confession (beforehand) and receive Holy Communion (on that day) shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and temporal punishment.
- * On that day, all the divine floodgates through which Graces flow, are opened.
- * Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet.
- * My Mercy is so great that no mind, be it of man or angel, will be able to fathom it throughout eternity.
- * Every soul in its relation to Me will contemplate My Love and Mercy throughout all eternity.
- * The Feast of Mercy emerged from My very depths of tenderness.
- * It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter.
- * Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the FOUNT of My Mercy.
