The only things our eyes ought to see and our ears to hear are things, images, and words that can only uplift us and teach us to do the right thing: good, holy advice and direction. Most of the time, it is all good.

My brothers and sisters, during this Feast of Pentecost that we celebrate this weekend, ask Jesus in prayer to give you a greater experience of the PEACE of the Holy Spirit that He gave to His Apostles when He appeared to them after His Resurrection and said to them two times; "Peace be with you."
