## From Fishing to Shepherding

I haven't gone fishing for many years. I know that it is a very popular sport. I do enjoy eating fish, especially at our dinners during the season of Lent. Along with millions of other people, I am very grateful for those who make their living by fishing, in order to provide this food for the whole world.

We hear in this weekend's Gospel that Jesus again reveals Himself to His Apostles after His Resurrection. This time, Jesus shows up at the shore along the Sea of Tiberias. Several hours before this, Peter had decided to go fishing in late evening with the other Apostles joining him, "but that night, they caught nothing." (John 21: 3)

At dawn, the Risen Lord was already on the seashore, baking fish on an open fire for His Apostles. He told His Apostles to cast their nets on the right side of the boat. The Apostle John recognized it was Jesus. In doing this, they brought in an overwhelming number of large fish--153! The number of 153 fish symbolizes that they caught a large number of fish.

In this chapter from St. John's Gospel, we learn a lot about the Apostle Peter. He is absolutely set on following Jesus. In this story, Peter was the first to jump out of the boat and run to Jesus, Who was standing on the seashore. The Disciples had breakfast with Jesus. The vocation of Peter's work at this time would now go from **fishing to shepherding**.

No longer would Peter need a net to fish for a living. As we have heard last Sunday, in the Acts of the Apostles, Chapter 5, and this Sunday as well, Peter's full time work now would be healing in Jesus's Name and teaching about Jesus as Savior and Lord.

Toward the end of this Sunday's Gospel from John 21, Jesus asks Peter three times "Do you love me?" Peter, who denied our Lord three times during His Passion, is now so deeply taken by the Risen Lord, that his response is "You know that I love You." (John 21: 17) Peter then is given the ministry of **shepherding and feeding** God's People with the Word of the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist.

We are grateful for all of the deacons, priests, monsignors, bishops, and cardinals who shepherd our Church today. May we continue to pray for each of them.
